On Monday, April 1, 2019, Summit County Executive Ilene Shapiro and Summit County Council passed legislation declaring the month of April 2019 Child Abuse and Family Awareness Month in Summit County. The legislation, sponsored by Executive Shapiro and District 8 Council Member Paula Prentice, recognizes the value of raising awareness in the community about the importance of prevention and reporting of child abuse and neglect.

Summit County Children Services (SCCS) developed Child and Family Awareness Month over 30 years ago in an effort to increase awareness about child abuse and prevention. In support of this awareness campaign, SCCS promotes a month-long education, awareness and celebration of the family program that includes trainings, Wear Blue Day, and an appreciation breakfast.

"Every one of us can play a role in preventing child abuse and neglect," said Executive Shapiro. "From becoming a foster parent or adopting a child to mentoring a child or donating to SCCS, we can all find a way to raise awareness and support families. Thank you to SCCS for their continued advocacy and leadership in our community on behalf of children and families."
