

Guidelines for Reporting a Hazmat Spill



Verbal Notification Requirement

To report a spill or discharge in Summit County, call the LEPC: 330-643-2522 and the OEPA: 800-282-9378. An owner or operator is required to report a release or discharge under 3750.06 of the Ohio Revised Code anytime there is a release or spill of a regulated chemical which exceeds its assigned Reportable Quantity (RQ) and leaves the facility property line. Verbal notification to the fire department, LEPC, and Ohio EPA shall be made within 30 minutes of knowledge of the release, unless notification within that timeframe is impractical due to uncertain circumstances. Be prepared to relay as much of the information listed below as is known or can be estimated at the time of reporting. Please remember this is an initial report and estimates can be corrected in your follow-up emergency notice report.

- Name and phone number of the person to contact for further information
- Location and source of the release or discharge
- Chemical name or identity of any substance involved in the release or discharge
- Is the substance an extremely hazardous substance
- Estimate of the quantity (gallons or pounds) discharged into the environment
- Time and duration of the release or discharge
- The environmental medium or media into which the substance was released or discharged
- Potential health effects associated with the release or discharge of the substance
- Report precautions taken, include evacuation, remediation or other proposed response actions.

Written Follow-up Requirements

After the spill, release or discharge, written follow-up emergency notice must be submitted within 30 days to the Ohio EPA Emergency Response Section and the local planning committee of the planning district in which the release or discharge occurred, unless the release was from a vessel, and then the report is sent only to the SERC. It is the <u>Spiller's requirement</u> to submit the follow-up emergency notice to explain in their own words the circumstances and actions relating to the release of pollutants to the environment.

- This information is required pursuant to ORC 3750.06(D) and OAC Rule 3750-25-25(A) (2).
