Glenn Wong Sentenced to Life in Prison without Parole

(July 21, 2014... Akron) ... Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Judge Paul Gallagher sentenced Glenn Wong, 52, of Abrams Drive in Twinsburg, to life in prison. He will not be eligible for parole.

On the morning of February 24, 2013, Wong and his wife Tami got into a brief argument. He left their bedroom, walked past their two young children in the family room and into the kitchen, where he retrieved two large knives from the knife block. Wong then returned to his bedroom and stabbed Tami 103 times. The couple's 10-year-old daughter heard her mother screaming for help and called 911. When Twinsburg police arrived, they found Wong on top of Tami. She died en route to the Cleveland Clinic in Twinsburg.

"The murder of Tami Wong shocked the community with its brutality. It is, sadly, an example of the tragic end to the cycle of violence in the worst domestic violence cases," said Prosecutor Walsh. "Now that Glenn is heading to prison for the remainder of his life, I hope his young children and the many friends and family Tami left behind can begin the healing process."

A jury found Wong guilty of two counts of Aggravated Murder; Murder, a felony of the first degree; Felonious Assault, a felony of the second degree; and Domestic Violence, a misdemeanor of the first degree; on March 28.
