Akron Man Sentenced to Mandatory Prison Time for Making & Possessing Meth

AKRON, Ohio (Tuesday, January 26, 2016) – Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Summit County Common Pleas Court Judge Tom Parker sentenced Robert Kolvek, 50, of Stanley Road in Akron, to a mandatory 12 years in prison.

On December 18, 2015, jurors found Kolvek guilty of the following charges:

- Illegal Manufacture of Drugs – a felony of the 1st degree
- Two counts of Illegal Assembly or Possession of Chemicals for the Manufacture of Drugs – felonies of the 3rd degree
- Aggravated Possession of Drugs – a felony of the 5th degree

In April of 2015, Akron Police responded to a complaint at a home on Archwood Avenue. At the home and inside a vehicle in the home's garage, officers found ingredients for a meth lab. Officers determined Robert Kolvek's girlfriend lived at the home; however Kolvek was not home at the time.

While at that address, officers were alerted to another meth lab at Kolvek's home on Stanley Road in Akron. At that home, Investigators discovered additional material used in the manufacture of meth.

The following month, Cuyahoga Falls Police received an alert that Kolvek was attempting to purchase pseudoephedrine, a key ingredient in making meth. Kolvek was then arrested.
