### **Akron Man Pleads Guilty to Uncle's Heroin Death** *Larry Moore Sentenced to 5½ Years in Prison*

AKRON, Ohio (Tuesday, May 10, 2016) – Summit County Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Larry Moore, 27, of East Ralston Avenue in Akron, pled guilty in connection with the heroin death of his uncle, 43-Year-Old Robert Mullens.

Moore pled guilty to the following charges:

- Involuntary Manslaughter – a felony of the 1<sup>st</sup> degree
- Aggravated Trafficking – a felony of the 2<sup>nd</sup> degree
- Trafficking in Heroin – a felony of the 5<sup>th</sup> degree

Summit County Common Pleas Court Judge Tom Teodosio immediately sentenced Moore to five and a half years in prison. Moore must also forfeit over \$3,000 seized by investigators.

In February of 2015, Robert Mullens was found dead in his house. Investigators determined Moore provided Mullens with heroin the day before Mullens was found dead. Then, 10 months later, investigators received information that Moore was selling drugs out of the same house where his uncle had died. Police also found crystal meth inside the home.
