### **Man Sentenced in Major Drug Charges, Gang Activity**

(April 21, 2009, Akron) ... Prosecutor Sherri Bevan Walsh announced today that Ray Gaiter, 29, of Akron, was sentenced to 24 years in prison by Judge Hunter. Gaiter was found guilty on March 24 of **Possession of Cocaine (with a Major Drug Offender Specification)**, a felony of the first degree, **Participating in a Criminal Gang**, a felony of the second degree, **Failure to Comply, Tampering with Evidence** and **Having Weapons Under Disability**, all felonies of the third degree, **Carrying a Concealed Weapon**, a felony of the fourth degree, and **Possession of Marijuana** (two counts) and **Speeding**, both minor misdemeanors.

On April 16, 2008, officers were following Gaiter in his vehicle and saw him throw something out of the window. When an officer retrieved the item, 134 grams of crack cocaine was discovered. After throwing the drugs out of the window, Gaiter refused to stop and a pursuit ensued. He was later apprehended after a short foot chase. A gang charge was added later when officers from the Akron Gang Unit discovered that he was a member of the Kaika Klan Outlaws.

While Gaiter was out on bond for the April 16, 2008 offense, he was pulled over for a traffic violation (February 11, 2009). At that time, officers found a loaded gun in the center console.
